What is Neo Imperialism?

 the specific historical period between 1750-1914 when expansionism of European nations accelerated.



Imperialism:

Policy of extending a country's power over other nations through diplomacy, economic dominance or military force.

Empire:

An extensive group of states or countries under a single supreme authority, especially an emperor or empress (e.g. The British Empire).



Reasons for Imperialism

- Moved by greed and competition: several industrial countries engaged in imperialism (i.e., Britain).
- The empires exploited the colonies (they took land and resources).
- There was a set of <u>ideas that</u> <u>supported imperialism</u> (e.g. racism)





Causes of	Imperial	lism

1. Exploitation of natural resources.

Coffee, sugar, palm oil, tea, timber, tin, rubber, spices, etc.

2. Opening of new markets for trade.

Industrialized nations needed new consumers for their increasing production of goods.

Causes of Imperialism

3. Geopolitics: competition among empires

European nations were engaged in a heated rivalry over resources, markets and <u>strategic territories</u>.

For example, over the control of channels, rivers, mines, ports, islands, etc.

How did the empires exercise their hegemony?

1. Military power

Industrialized countries were able to produce more and better technology to dominate other nations.

- a) <u>Machine gun:</u> allowed strong defensive positions against a multitude.
- b) Telegraph: allowed improved communications.
- c) Steamboat: allowed faster, safer transportation.

2. Trade control

By imposing tariffs, the <u>metropolis</u> controlled commerce from and to the colonies. A key element for this control was <u>maritime power</u>.



How did the empires exercise their hegemony?

3. Economic superiority

Industrialized countries produced more, better and cheaper manufactured goods than their colonies.

E.g. Great Britain imported cotton from India, manufactured clothes with it, and then sold the clothes back to the Indian people.

Manufactured goods are more valuable than raw materials.

How did the empires exercise their hegemony?

4. Alliance with local elites

The imperialists offer positions of power to the local elite, as a form of securing their control over the population of the colonies ("Divide and conquer").

Why did Europeans allied with the elites of their colonies? Why did the elites choose to ally themselves with the Europeans?

How did the empires exercise their hegemony? 5. Racism The colonizers (Europeans) thought that they belonged to a superior race.

5. Racism

Social Darwinism:

Theory that indicated that individuals are subject to the same <u>laws of natural selection</u> as in Charles Darwin's Theory of Evolution, hence it proclaimed that the most fit individuals will succeed and dominate the weaker. Although <u>it is currently discredited</u>, it was used during the 19th century by supporters of imperialism and racism.

• Eugenics was a popular conception during the height of New-Imperialism. Many countries, like the United States, adopted laws benefiting one specific racial/ethnic group over others.
