Splitsville Bowling Activity By Ken W. (Grade 12) (China)



Compared to other sports, bowling is relatively low-risk. However, for a novice or "self-righteous" veteran, there are still certain risks when delivering the ball down the bowling alley. On Saturday December 31st, 2022, my dormmates and I had the privilege to go bowling and from this experience, I was able to reflect on how to successfully play the sport. First of all, it is important to keep the soles of your bowling shoes clean and dry. When the bowling ball is released from the hand, the supporting leg can slide from its original position. Hence, when the soles are dry, the friction caused by the shoes' soles is relatively small, making it easier to glide along the bowling alley while effectively maintaining body balance. If the soles of the shoes come in contact with water, drinks, or oil as one steps towards the bowling alley, the friction caused by the soles becomes greater, which affects gliding and increases your chances of falling if you aren't careful.

In addition, you need to choose the right bowling ball according to your own ability. Some people randomly choose a bowling ball weight regardless of their capabilities. In fact, this mindset is not only wrong, but also very dangerous.

Finally, I've learnt that when you are inexperienced and don't know how to properly control a bowling ball, it can easily cause the ball to fly out as you swing your arm for release.

In conclusion, I really enjoyed bowling and I would definitely recommend it to anyone who is considering the sport.
