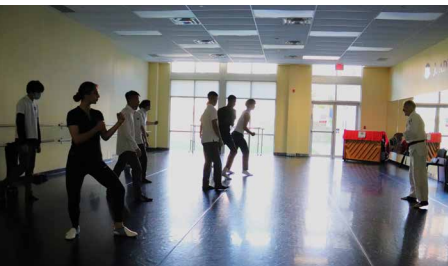

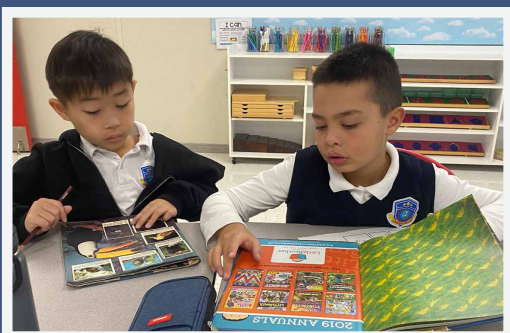
Thanksgiving Celebration “What a Blast!” By Rafiat A. (Grade 12) (Nigeria)
