The school is thrilled to announce the successful completion and activation of our new rooftop solar panel system. This exciting upgrade represents a significant investment in both sustainable infrastructure and our school's commitment to environmental stewardship.

The positive impact is already being realized; for the month of September alone, the system's clean energy production has yielded remarkable environmental benefits. Our efforts are equivalent to planting approximately 11 trees, reducing atmospheric carbon dioxide by an estimated 19.6 tonnes, and saving nearly 8 tonnes of coal. This initiative not lessens our carbon footprint but also serves as a powerful, living laboratory for our students, providing a real-world example of innovation and responsibility in action. We look forward to sharing more updates on our green energy journey.

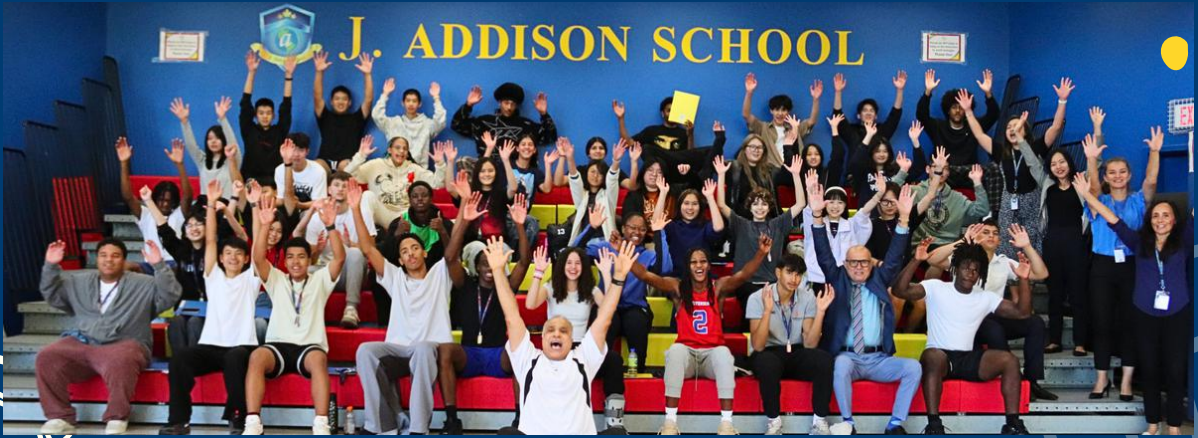
